
1. A \flat flat sign **lowers** the pitch of a note by half a step.

3. A \natural natural sign cancels the effect of a **flat** or **sharp**.
4. Sharps and flats are called **accidentals**.
5. Which of the following is a wrong statement?
 - A flat or a sharp affect each note on the same line or in the same space for a whole bar.
 - A natural cancels a sharp or flat sign within one bar/measure
 - A bar line does not cancel a sharp or flat.
 - When a note is tied across the bar, the effect of an accidental is resolved


