


WHOLE AND SEMITONE STEPS

Notes of a scale are separated by whole and half (semitone) steps, as can easily be seen on the piano keyboard.



Neighboring keys on the piano are a half step apart; therefore, E to F is half a step, while C to D containing C# (two keys or two half steps) is a whole step. As you already know, the black keys are named after the white keys. Each black key therefore has two names (enharmonic tones).



1. Name the notes and indicate whether the space between the first and second notes is a whole step (WS) or a half step (HS).



2. Name the notes and indicate the space between them. (1 or $\frac{1}{2}$)



3. Name the notes and identify the space between them. (1 or $\frac{1}{2}$)



4. Name the notes and identify the space between them. (WS or HS)
